

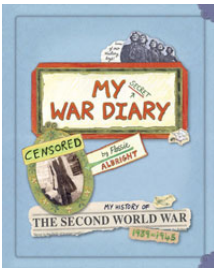
ALL ABOUT MY BOOKS!

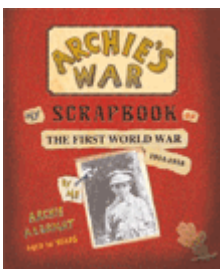

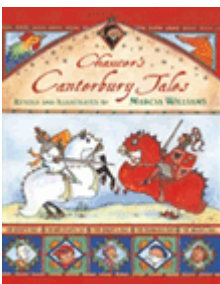

Three Cheers for Inventors! (2005)

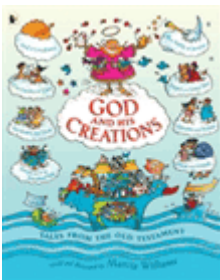

The Iliad and The Odyssey (1996)

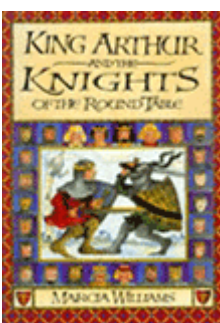

King Arthur and The Knights of The Round Table (1996)

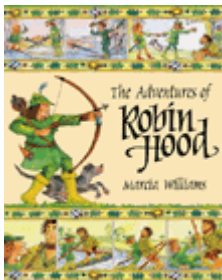

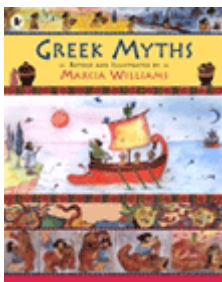

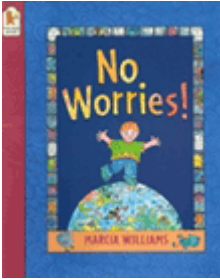
